

MNE 2006 Manuscript Submission: Instructions for authors

All the authors of invited and accepted contributions to MNE2006 are invited to submit a full 4 page article to the journal Microelectronic Engineering (Elsevier). A special volume of Microelectronics Engineering will appear by April 2007 (Editors: Gabriel Abadal, Joan Bausells and Francesc Perez-Murano)

Submission of papers

Original material: Submission of an article implies that the work described has not been published previously (except in the form of an abstract or as part of a published lecture or academic thesis), that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, that its publication is approved by all authors and that, if accepted, it will not be published elsewhere in the same form, in English or in any other language, without the written consent of the Publisher.

Detailed instructions on manuscript preparation and artwork instructions can be found below. The Editors reserve the right to return manuscripts that do not

conform to the instructions for manuscript preparation and artwork instruction, as well as papers that do not fit the scope of the issue, prior to refereeing.

NOTE THAT THE MAXIMUM ALLOCATED EXTENSION OF THE ARTICLE IS OF 4 JOURNAL PAGES.

Manuscript Preparation:

Structure:

Follow this order when typing manuscripts: Title, Authors, Affiliations, Abstract, Keywords, Main text, Acknowledgements, Appendix, References, Figure Captions and then Tables. Collate acknowledgements in a separate section at the end of the article and do not include them on the title page, as a footnote to the title or otherwise.

Text Layout:

Use double spacing and wide (3 cm) margins. (Avoid full justification, i.e., do not use a constant right-hand margin.) Ensure that each new paragraph is clearly indicated. Present tables and figure legends on separate pages at the end of the manuscript. If possible, consult a recent issue of the journal to become familiar with layout and conventions. Number all pages consecutively; use 12 or 10 pt font size and standard fonts.

Corresponding author:

Clearly indicate who is responsible for correspondence at all stages of refereeing and publication, including post-publication. Full postal addresses must be given for all co-authors. Please consult a recent journal paper for style if possible.

Abstract:

A self-contained abstract outlining in a single paragraph the aims, scope and conclusions of the paper must be supplied.

Keywords:

Immediately after the abstract, provide a maximum of six keywords (avoid, for example, 'and', 'of'). Be sparing with abbreviations: only abbreviations firmly established in the field may be eligible.

Units:

Follow internationally accepted rules and conventions: use the international system of units (SI). If other quantities are mentioned, give their equivalent in SI.

Maths:

Number consecutively any equations that have to be displayed separately from the text (if referred to explicitly in the text).

References:

All publications cited in the text should be presented in a list of references following the text of the manuscript.

Text: Indicate references by number(s) in square brackets in line with the text. The actual authors can be referred to, but the reference number(s) must always be given.

List: Number the references (numbers in square brackets) in the list in the order in which they appear in the text.

Examples:

Reference to a journal publication:

Reference to a book:

[2] W. Strunk Jr., E.B. White, *The elements of style*, 3rd ed., Macmillan, New York, 1979.

Reference to a chapter in an edited book:

[3] G.R. Mettam, L.B. Adams, in: B.S. Jones, R.Z. Smith, eds., *Introduction to the electronic age*, E-Publishing Inc., New York, 1999, p. 281.

Reference to Conference Proceedings:

[4] K.E. Petersen, in: *Tech. Digest, IEEE Int. Electron Devices Meet.*, Washington, DC, USA, Dec. 2-7, 1985, p. 534.

Colour Costs and Queries:

For colour illustrations, a colour printing fee is charged to the author per colour page. Further information concerning colour illustrations and costs is available from Author Support at authorsupport@elsevier.ie, and at <http://authors.elsevier.com/locate/authorartwork>.

FREE ONLINE COLOUR::

If, together with your accepted article, you submit usable colour and black/white figures then Elsevier will ensure, at no additional charge, that these figures will appear in colour on the web (e.g., ScienceDirect and other sites) regardless of whether or not these illustrations are reproduced in colour in the printed version.

Please note: Because of technical complications which can arise by converting colour figures to "grey scale" (for the black/white printed version of e-colour) please submit AFTER REVISION usable black and white versions of all the colour illustrations. Also make sure that in your captions and text you do not refer to colour, as the images will be black and white in print, and references to colour will not make any sense to the reader of the print journal.

'Usable' means the formats comply with our instructions. See the information about Illustrations at <http://authors.elsevier.com/locate/authorartwork>.

Tables:

Tables should be numbered consecutively and given suitable captions. Each table should begin on a new page. No vertical rules should be used. Tables should not duplicate results presented elsewhere in the manuscript (for example, in graphs). Footnotes to tables should be typed below the table and should be referred to by superscript lowercase letters.

Estimation of the length of an article:

The maximum allocated extension for the article is 4 journal pages. Due to the large number of papers submitted to MNE2006, this rule must strictly be followed.

Note that an average article opening (title up and including the abstract) is about 1/2 a page, so that only 3.5 pages are available for the text and figures.

An average 4-page article contains about 1500-2000 words, excluding the abstract and the references, but this strongly depends on the number and size of figures and tables.

We recommend checking a recent journal paper, since this gives a good indication regarding the layout and length.

Notification:

Authors will be notified of the acceptance of their paper by the editor.

Copyright:

All authors must sign the Transfer of Copyright agreement before the article can be published. This transfer agreement enables Elsevier to protect the copyrighted material for the authors, but does not relinquish the authors' proprietary rights. The copyright transfer covers the exclusive rights to reproduce and distribute the article, including reprints, photographic reproductions, microfilm or any other reproductions of similar nature and translations. Authors are responsible for obtaining from the copyright holder permission to reproduce any figures for which copyright exists.

PDF Proofs:

One set of page proofs in PDF format will be sent by e-mail to the corresponding author, to be checked for typesetting/editing. The corrections should be returned within 48 hours. No changes in, or additions to, the accepted (and subsequently edited) manuscript will be allowed at this stage. Proofreading is solely the author's responsibility. Any queries should be answered in full. Please correct factual errors only, or errors introduced by typesetting.
